### Obsessive Compulsive Disorder- OCD

A serious anxiety-related condition where a person experiences frequent intrusive and unwelcome obsessional thoughts, often followed by repetitive compulsions, impulses or urges.



### OCD

# Typically a person's OCD will fall into one of the four main categories:

Checking

Contamination / Mental Contamination

Hoarding

Ruminations (thinking something over and over again)/ Intrusive Thoughts

#### **Hoarding disorder**


#### **Excoriation disorder**

Either obsession (recurring thoughts/ images etc) and/ or compulsions (hand washing)


Most people have both compulsions and obsessions

#### Compulsive hair pulling

The compulsive gathering of possessions and the inability to part with anything regardless of its value Compulsive skin picking

#### What is 'obsessive-compulsive disorder'?
