In 1961 we increased our military aid to Cuba. We were sure the Americans would never agree to the existence of Castro's Cuba. They feared that a socialist Cuba would attract other Latin American countries to socialism. We had to find an effective deterrent to American interference in Cuba. The Cuban missile crisis was a triumph for Soviet foreign policy and a personal triumph in my career. Today, Cuba exists as an independent socialist country right in front of America. We forced the US to demobilise and recognise Cuba.
