Case Study

The flat is in need of some major repairs, it is also damp, with mould growing in the bathroom and on some of the windows, and very expensive to keep warm in the winter due to an old inefficient boiler. Neither Ryan nor Simone are currently in paid employment.

The family are generally in poor health. In the winter the children tend to have permanent colds, coughs and runny noses.
