

#### A Resource for Bilingual Pupils

Quite often the content of the National Curriculum can be intractable for pupils who speak English as a second language. The teaching of English can now be made wholly accessible using set texts which have been effectively differentiated so that they are understood by pupils who may find the original version difficult.

This text has been widely used in English and Special Needs classrooms to promote the development of reading, writing and listening skills. It has proven to be popular because of its accessibility and at the end of each section there is a series of stimulating exercises designed to enhance language acquisition. Developing literary appreciation is an integral part of the National Curriculum and this resource is designed to develop this skill.

This text is studied for the NEAB Certificate of Achievement in years 9-11. As teachers, we know that understanding the text not only activates interest, but can help pupils to obtain encouraging grades in their Certificate of Achievement.

'An Inspector Calls' is divided into three acts. It takes place in the dining-room of a big house. The house belongs to a rich man who is called Arthur Birling.


'An Inspector Calls' takes place in the spring of 1912.







### Characters











#### Act One

The dining-room of a big house. The furniture is expensive. There are five people sitting at the dining-table. They are Arthur Birling, his wife, his son and his daughter. Also, at the table is Gerald Croft. He is going to marry Sheila Birling.

They have just finished eating their dinner. The maid is cleaning the table.

Arthur Birling is about fifty years (50) old. He is a big man.

Sybil Birling is also about fifty years (50) old. She is not very nice.

Sheila Birling is about twenty-two years (22) old. She is pretty and happy.

Eric Birling is about twenty-four years (24) old. He is shy and nervous.

Gerald Croft is thirty years (30) old. He wears expensive clothes.

ARTHUR: Dinner was very tasty. I really

enjoyed it.

GERALD: It was delicious.

SHEILA [smiling]: I wonder what happened to you last summer.

GERALD: I told you I was very busy. I was

working very hard.

**ARTHUR**: This is one of the happiest days of

my life, Gerald's engagement to Sheila means a lot to me. She will make you happy. I am sure you will make Sheila happy. You're just the kind of son-in-law I wanted. Gerald

you are a lucky man.

MRS BIRLING: Yes, Gerald. Yes, Sheila darling!

Our congratulations and very best

wishes!

GERALD: Thank you. I have got a surprise

for Sheila. [He gives Sheila a ring.]

SHEILA [she puts the ring on]: This is perfect. Now

I really feel engaged.

[Mrs Birling and Sheila go out of the dining-room. Arthur Birling, Eric and Gerald sit down.]

ARTHUR: Cigar?

GERALD: No, thanks. I don't smoke. You all

seem to be a nice family.

**EDNA:** Please sir, an inspector's called.

ARTHUR: An inspector? What kind of

inspector?

**EDNA:** A police inspector. His name is

Inspector Goole.

ARTHUR: I don't know him. Does he want to

see me?

EDNA: Yes, sir. He says it's important.

ARTHUR: All right. [He looks at Eric.] What's

wrong with you?

ERIC [frightened]: Nothing.

**EDNA:** Inspector Goole.

[Enter Inspector Goole. He is about fifty-five (55) years old. He is wearing a grey suit. He speaks slowly.]


INSPECTOR: Mr Birling.

ARTHUR: Yes. Please sit down, Inspector.

INSPECTOR: I'd like some information, Mr

Birling. Two hours ago a young

woman died in hospital. She committed suicide.

ERIC: My God!

**INSPECTOR:** Yes, she was in great pain. The

doctors did everything for her.

But she died.

ARTHUR: I don't understand why you have

come here, Inspector.

**INSPECTOR:** I went to her flat. She left a

diary. Her real name was Eva

Smith. Do you remember her, Mr

Birling? [The Inspector shows

Arthur a photograph.]

I think you remember Eva Smith

now, don't you?

ARTHUR: Yes, I do. She used to work in my

factory. Then I sacked her.

It happened about two years ago. What has this got to do with her

suicide?

**INSPECTOR:** That might have started it.

ARTHUR: I remember Eva Smith. She was a

good-looking girl. Eva was also a good worker. She organised a strike because the workers wanted more money. The strike failed. I sacked Eva.

**ERIC:** What is wrong if people want more

wages? I don't understand why

you had to sack her.

[Sheila now comes into the dining-room.]

SHEILA: What's happening?

**INSPECTOR:** I'm a police inspector, Miss Birling.

This afternoon a woman took some

poison and died.

SHEILA: Oh - how horrible! Was it an

accident?

INSPECTOR: No. She wanted to end her life.

ARTHUR: Do you know what happened to her

after she left my factory?

**INSPECTOR:** Yes. She was out of work for the

next two months. Both her parents were dead. She had no money and

no friends.

SHEILA: But what happened to her then?

INSPECTOR: She was very lucky. Eva got a job

in a clothes shop. The shop was called Milward's. It was a good

shop.

SHEILA: Milward's! We go there - in fact, I

was there this afternoon. She was

lucky to work at Milward's.

**INSPECTOR:** That's what she thought. Eva

enjoyed working at the shop. One

day she was told to leave. A customer complained about her.

SHEILA: When was this?

INSPECTOR: At the end of January - last year.

SHEILA: What did this girl look like?

**INSPECTOR:** If you'll come over here, I will

show you. [The Inspector shows Sheila a photograph. She starts to

cry.]

SHEILA: You knew it was me all the time,

didn't you? I feel very bad. So I

am responsible for her death?

**INSPECTOR:** No. A lot happened to her after

she left Milward's. But you and your father are partly to blame.

SHEILA: I went to the manager at

Milward's. I told him to get rid of

that girl.

**INSPECTOR:** And why did you do that?

SHEILA: Because I was in a furious temper.

I tried a dress on. When I was

looking at myself in the mirror, she was laughing at me. I became angry

... She was very pretty.

**INSPECTOR:** So you were jealous of her?

SHEILA: Yes. It was the only time I have

ever done anything bad. Oh! Why


has this happened?


**INSPECTOR:** We need to understand why this

her suicide.

a very good person.





SHEILA: Mother, I know you recognise her.

INSPECTOR: Mrs Birling, are you a member of a

Women's Charity?

MRS BIRLING: Yes.

**INSPECTOR:** The Charity helps women who are

poor. Was there a meeting two

weeks ago?

MRS BIRLING: Yes.

**INSPECTOR:** You spoke to Eva Smith two weeks

ago?

MRS BIRLING: Yes.







mother did not help her.

**ERIC:** Then mother you killed her. You

turned her away - yes - and you killed her - and the child - my child - your own grandchild. You killed

them both.

MRS BIRLING: No - Eric - please - I didn't know.

ERIC: You don't understand anything.

[Everyone starts shouting and arguing.]

**INSPECTOR**: Be quiet and listen to me. This girl

killed herself. Each of you helped

to kill her. Never forget it.

SHEILA: I started it.

**INSPECTOR**: You did not start it. Your father

started it. Eva Smith wanted more wages. Arthur Birling sacked her.

Gerald Croft used her as a

mistress. Eric Birling used her as if

she was an animal. Mrs Birling

turned her away when she most needed help.

[Everyone is quiet.]

Just remember this. We are all responsible for each other. Good night.

[The Inspector walks out.]

SHEILA: Was he really a police inspector?

[There is a ring at the front door. Gerald Croft comes back in.]

GERALD: When did the Inspector go?

ARTHUR: A few minutes ago. You know

something. What is it?

GERALD: That man was not a police officer.

ARTHUR: What?

GERALD: Yes. I met a policeman. I asked him

about an Inspector Goole. He told me there was not any Inspector

Goole.

[Arthur Birling goes to the telephone. He phones the police station.]

ARTHUR: Mr Arthur Birling speaking... sorry

to phone so late... Can you tell me if an Inspector Goole has joined

your staff... Goole ... G-O-O-L-E ... Thank you and goodbye. [*Arthur Birling puts the phone down.]* There is no Inspector Goole.

SHEILA: It does not matter if he was not an

inspector. It's the same story.

**ERIC**: The fact is we all killed Eva Smith.

**GERALD:** But is it a fact?

ARTHUR: The whole evening was a bluff.

ERIC: How can it be? The girl is dead.

ARTHUR: Is she? How do we know she is

dead?

GERALD: How do we know any girl killed

herself today? I will phone the

hospital. [He goes to the

telephone.]

Hello, is this the hospital? Has a girl committed suicide today? ... Are you certain? ... Thank you very much. Good night. [He puts the

telephone down.]

No girl has died in the hospital today. No one has committed

suicide.

**ARTHUR**: The whole story is not true.

**SHEILA**: So there is nothing to be sorry

for. Nothing to learn.

ARTHUR: Sheila, ask Gerald for that ring you

gave back to him.

SHEILA: No, not yet. It's too soon.

[The telephone rings. Arthur Birling goes to answer it.]

ARTHUR: Yes? ... Mr Birling speaking... What?

- here- [He puts the telephone down and looks at everyone.]

That was the police. A girl has just

committed suicide. A police

inspector is on his way here - to -

ask some questions.

[They all look at each other.]

#### Who is Inspector Goole?

Inspector Goole is a very important character in 'An Inspector Calls'. He questions each member of the Birling family and Gerald Croft. The Inspector manages to link all the characters to the death of Eva Smith/Daisy Renton.

The name *Goole* is a homophone. *Ghoul* is a ghost. A homophone is when two words sound the same but have a different meaning.

#### Dates and events

In **An Inspector Calls** the play takes place in the dining room of the Birling's House. Each character is questioned by the Inspector. All have been involved with Eva Smith/Daisy Renton. We never see her.

September 1910 Eva is sacked by Arthur Birling.

'She had to go.'

ON STRIKE

December 1910 Eva got a job at a dress shop called Milwards.



January 1910 Eva had to leave her job.

'I told the manager to get rid of her (Eva Smith).'

March 1911 Eva changes her name to Daisy Renton.

Gerald met her in a bar. They had an affair.



September 1911 Gerald ends his love affair with Daisy Renton.

This was the best time in Daisy's life. She was so

happy.

November 1911 Eric took advantage of Eva Smith. He had a brief

affair with her. Eric stole money from his father and

gave it to Eva.

January 1912 Eva was pregnant. She was not married.



March 1912 Eva went to Mrs Birling's charity organisation for help.

She had no money. Eva was helpless.

Mrs Birling did not help Eva.


April 1912 The Birling family are having a dinner party.
