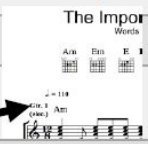

TEMPO

Speed of the music

How can we describe tempo?		
	For example...	
General adjectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fast/slow Bouncy 	 <p>Just this? Good</p>
Specific speed description	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> BPM - Beats Per Minute (number of beats in every minute) 	<p>Add this? Better</p>
Italian technical vocab	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lento = slower Andante = at a walking pace Moderato = at a moderate speed Allegretto = fast but not too fast Allegro = fast Presto = very fast Accelerando = getting quicker Rallentando = getting slower 	<p>Add this too? The best!</p>

Reminder of the type of language you could use.

How can we work out beats per minute (BPM)?

1. Tap along to the beat of the music
2. Count how many beats you tap in 15 seconds
3. (taps in 15 seconds) x 4 = beats per min

Example:

Version	Describe the tempo (Pass)	Why might the composer choose this tempo? (Merit+)
Billy Ocean	ADJECTIVE - bouncy BPM - around 80bpm TECHNICAL VOCAB - intro slower (<i>andante</i>), then main song faster tempo (<i>allegretto</i>)	STYLE - this tempo is typical of the electro/soul genre - not a surprise! MESSAGE - It's meant to be about the thrills and sense of danger of being attracted to someone - Happiness, although singer is conflicted a bit, ultimately it's about positive emotions - fast-ish tempo makes it sound a bit chaotic like his emotions - emotional rollercoaster

The **instruments** used in the music

How can we describe instrumentation?		
	For example...	
Identify individual instruments	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Electric guitar • Voice • Nose flute 	Just this? Good
Identify groups of instruments	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Brass band • Choir • Jazz quintet • Nose flute choir 	Add this? Better - if relevant
Explain role/importance of instrument	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In the verses the guitar is just one of the backing instruments, playing chords In the chorus it takes a lead role playing some of the melody (which is finger-picked) 	Add this too? The best!

Reminder of the type of language you could use.

Example:

<p> Lover - Taylor Swift</p>	<p>INSTRUMENTS - drum kit, piano, bass, acoustic guitar, piano, effects-laden backing vocals, main female vocals, some exciting violins plucking away later on!</p> <p>ROLES - Intro just bass and kit Piano comes in for thicker texture in the first chorus. The focus of this song is the vocals. Everything else <u>is</u> very soft and in the background.</p>	<p>STYLE - Guitar, bass and vocals is a typical country combo. The instrumentation is generally quite pared back, in-keeping with the country influences. MESSAGE - simple message; simple instrumentation.</p>

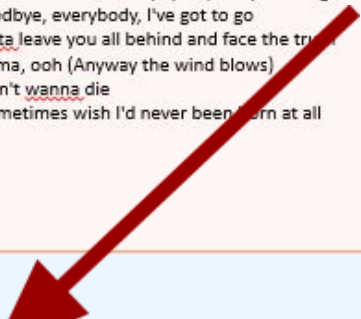
	For example...	
Identify main message of song	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> “This song explores the mixed feelings of the protagonist who is still healing emotionally after a break-up so is asking his new potential love interest to give him some time.” 	Just this? Good
Analyse the lyrics - provide some insight into their meaning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Language techniques and their effect! 	Add this? Better
Explain how the words link to the music itself/style	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> “There is a lot of juxtaposition in the lyrics between ‘dark’ and ‘light’ concepts, which is matched in the music itself by the contrast between bass and soprano voices, and low chords with high-pitched piano melody. 	Add this too? The best!

Poverty? HIV/AIDS? LGBT+?</p> <p>- Seems very personal - Freddie talking about his life? Poor boy/poor family</p>
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Song	Describe the lyrical content (Pass)	How do the words, music and song style link together? (Merit+)
The Man - Taylor Swift	<p>Overall, what's it all about?</p> <p>Erm....who knows!? Speculation that it could be about Freddie Mercury's experience of being LGBT+.</p> <p>Protagonist is clearly distressed and feeling alone</p>	<p>STYLE - the words make about as much sense as the mishmash of styles! It somehow works. And it's very typical of Queen's music.</p> <p>MUSIC - In the:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> rock section - guitars and drums and ARGH - matches the angst in the lyrics, although it does sound surprisingly 'major'/positive - quite defiant. Opera section - words are very dramatic and there's the opposition of bismillah (invoking god) and <u>beezlebub</u> (devil) which matches the drama of the operatic style and the opposition between the very high and very low pitches of the voices Ballad sections - the words are very 'woe is me', which matches with the piano ballad style.

How can we describe tonality?		
	For example...	
Identify if major or minor overall	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Major (happy) Minor (sad) 	Just this? Good
Identify the specific key or scale used	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> C major B minor Blues scale - C, D, D#/Eb, E, G, A (major) or C, Eb, F, F#/Gb, G, Bb (minor) Modal (unlikely!) - uses modes, which are scales built ENTIRELY on the white notes of the keyboard. <i>E.g. Aeolian mode starts on A and just uses all the white notes up to the next A.</i> 	Add this? Better
Identify particularly interesting tonal features	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Chord progression(s) used (e.g. C, F, Am, G) Change from major to minor in different sections of the song Any interesting chords, like a Cadd9 	Add this too? The best!

Reminder of the type of language you could use.

REMEMBER: major = positive; minor = sad/dramatic

Example:

<p style="margin: 0;">Never Fallen in Love - The <u>Buzzcocks</u></p>	<p style="margin: 0;">MAJOR/MINOR - minor overall, but there is an upturn to the major in the last 2 lines of the chorus ‘ever fallen...you shouldn’t have fallen in love with’</p> <p style="margin: 0;">SPECIFIC KEY - C# minor</p> <p style="margin: 0;">ANYTHING INTERESTING - chords are basic, but does use 6 of them - a bit more complex than some punk songs</p>	<p style="margin: 0;">STYLE - Minor is not an uncommon punk tonality. The change to major at the end of the chorus is more surprising though.</p> <p style="margin: 0;">MESSAGE - minor tonality matches the sadness/desperation of the lyrics to an extent. Major in the chorus - it’s not all bad??</p>

PRODUCTION TECHNIQUES

Effects applied to an instrument or recording

Reminder of the type of language you could use.

Example:

What production techniques can we listen out for?		
Technique	Definition	For example...
Mix levels	How the track is mixed, i.e. the relative volumes of each instrument or vocal.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You know you listen to a recording sometimes and the vocal just doesn't feel quite loud enough - that's a problem with the mix - the voice is too quiet compared to other instrument.
Panning	<p>The way the track is presented in stereo sound (the balance between left and right). Where each instrument sounds like it's coming from.</p> <p>Are different instruments or vocals more prominent on one side (one ear!) of the recording?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ever listen to a song and it seems like the sound is moving from one ear to the other - that's panning! 8D music relies on panning to create that surround-sound, moving effect.
Effects	<p>Processes added to sounds to alter their characteristics.</p> <p>There's LOADS!</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reverb - A6 vs T4 Delay - similar to echo Compression - make vocals, bass and drums more even EQ - enhancing certain frequencies Chorus - loads of you! Ambient! Flange and Phasing - wibbly and weird!
Samples	You can 'sample' music from someone's song (e.g. Vanilla Ice samples Queen/Bowie in <i>Ice Ice Baby</i>), but you can also sample non-musical sounds.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Chatter, birds tweeting, traffic - anything!

Describe the mix - very tick texture - lots of percussion (drums, cymbals, whistles, etc), brass, bass, backing vox
Panning?

Effects? Delay on B's vox in Jay Z verse; overdubbed close harmony in middle 8, moments B's voice sound, brass probably been compressed' [... too even and not 'brassy enough']

Samples? *Are You My Woman (Tell Me So)*

STYLE - typical of 00's RnB - heavy production - clean, polished sound.

MESSAGE/FEEL - dance style matches the feel-good, deliriously happy message, and the polished production helps shape this.

Basically ask: **does this sound like it would if I'd recorded this in a classroom?**

If no, there's probably been some sort of effect added! The more you listen, the more you get to recognise what's going on.
