Our examination results at GCSE and A Level are outstanding. The majority of our students continue into our 6th Form Centre before moving on to university, apprenticeships or employment. When students join us in Year 7, they are encouraged to be ambitious and to consider their future. We provide a strong programme of careers support and guidance through the curriculum and enrichment activities, organised to encourage your daughter to think about her personal journey and future university and explore career interests.

Challenging our most able students both academically and through extra-curricular activities is important to us. There are many opportunities within the curriculum to accelerate students' progress where we feel that they have the ability to do so.

Our learning values underpin our strong pupil centric vision. So intrinsic are these values to our overall school ethos, we have focussed our

school 'House System' on them:

When your daughter comes to Brentford School for Girls she will be placed in one of the above 5 houses. The school uses the 'House System' to promote healthy competition and a sense of responsibility and community amongst our girls. A VARIED CURRICULUM

IN SINGLE SEX SCHOOLS,

RANGE OF OPPORTUNITIES. Subjects such
as sports, geography, maths, science and
technology are extremely popular among
our students, as are the arts.

Our curriculum is varied and inspiring and we are constantly looking for ways to ensure that it is the right provision for your daughter.

The arts are a strong and vibrant feature at Brentford and students can study art, textiles, drama, music, photography and film studies throughout the school. Students exhibit their work in school, locally and nationally.

At the end of the academic year, the school runs an 'Arts Week' event, where students are able to develop confidence as well as learning new skills. We also have a dedicated annual 'Art Exhibition' to celebrate and showcase our students incredible work from throughout the year.

Our show stopping school production is also highly regarded and much anticipated by everyone from within the local community.

In Year 7 and 8, students study a broad and balanced range of subjects including English, mathematics, science, humanities, art, drama, music, design technology, ICT, PSHCE and PE, as well as a dedicated reading lesson. In Year 9, our girls will have selected their GCSE preferences and begin to study GCSE content.

The school has a designated member of staff to lead on developing students' academic writing



skills across the school. Opportunities are also taken to promote numeracy throughout the curriculum. Good reading, writing, speaking, listening and numerical skills will help your daughter's achievement in all areas, as well as increasing confidence and self-esteem.

Excellent literacy can open doors to other subjects and forms the backbone of student learning. Students have specific reading lessons once a week.

In Key Stage 4, your daughter will continue to pursue an individualised curriculum pathway based around her option choices. This might be an academic English Baccalaureate or a more vocational course, depending upon her abilities, preferences and aspirations.

All students take the core subjects of English, mathematics and science, irrespective of their other choices because we know how important they are to the chances of progression post-16 and beyond.

Girls at single-sex schools are more likely to take advanced STEM subjects. Girls at single-sex schools were 85% more likely to take advanced mathematics than girls in co-ed schools, 79% more likely to study chemistry, 68% more likely to take intermediate mathematics, and 47% more likely to study physics.' Our teaching team includes graduates from Oxford and Cambridge and other top universities, teachers with over 20 years' experience, as well as newer teachers who bring with them the latest ideas in education. All staff benefit from extensive continuing professional development to innovate and inspire so education becomes an exciting and engaging journey leading to outstanding success for our students.

We run a regular refurbishment programme across the school. Each of our classrooms has the most up-to-date ICT equipment and we have several stand-alone ICT suites.

The school has a state-of-the-art, industry specification theatre where students are encouraged to develop their communication skills and become involved in public speaking, debating competitions and the annual school play, as

well as learning about 'backstage' and managing events.

We have a modern and well-equipped library, open to students before and after school and during the school day.

In July 2019, our outdoor, on-site sporting facilities were transformed with a new, impressive and highly enviable all-weather Astro turf sports pitch.

Students can be involved in the school and year councils, take on the responsibility of key leadership roles such as prefects, HUB ambassadors, house captains as well as participate in the hugely successful 'debate mate', the schools debating society.

The school works closely with the British Council and students have demonstrated their leadership qualities both in school, nationally and globally, by participating in various conferences and projects related to gender and the international dimension.

Building leadership skills and providing our girls with strong female role models, be these ex-students, older girls, teachers or girls within the peer group, is an important vehicle for inspiring young women and girls.

International Women's Day is a focus for us each year and we celebrate by inviting speakers to present at assemblies and also encourage our own students to share their stories. Seeking out the highest standards of education and encouraging our girls to be inquisitive and 'think' and 'ask questions' continually is a critical part of what will help to develop their independence and leadership qualities. Students are encouraged to actively have a voice.

Our girls regularly participate in national debating competitions, securing a place in the top 20% of schools across the country.

Brentford School is also the proud recipient of the highest level of the International Schools Award because of our links with schools around the world including Rwanda, India, Sweden and France.

We also have a vibrant and active alumninetwork who support our current students in providing careers advice and employment opportunities.

Flexibility and adaptability are competencies that help ensure success in everything our students do.

In the lives and careers of our girls there will be many demands placed upon them in this fast-changing world. To have a broad skill set, to see the world through others' eyes, to show humility and emotional intelligence and to have the ability to change and grow means out students are ready for life beyond school.

The school has a number of partnerships with universities in London and the UK. All students in Year

9 visit a university as part of their curriculum programme and there are a range of activities in Years 10 and 11, including university summer schools, which girls can choose to be involved in.

Our careers support from an early age is exceptional and Brentford School has achieved the Careers Quality Standard, a standard that only 10% of schools achieve nationally.

Trips and visits, including museum visits, residentials and foreign excursions are also an important part of wider school life.

Our girls have the opportunity to participate in a vast array of enrichment activities including visiting art museums, specialist exhibitions, team building activities, water-sports and international trips. Recent trips include, New York, Italy, France, Austria, Germany.

World Book Day celebrations are full of imagination and creativity and we encourage our girls to celebrate authors, illustrators, books and most importantly reading.

Our annual sports day is fantastic fun for everyone. Sport is an important part of the curriculum at Brentford School for Girls in building character, resilience, perseverance, confidence and teamwork and helps our girls to maintain energy and strength and improve mental sharpness and stamina.

Helping this to happen successfully is something we pride ourselves on.

We work with a number of local primary schools from Year 5, familiarising students about life at secondary school before they make their choices in Year 6. All prospective students are involved in a variety of activities in the summer term before joining the school, including subject specific and cross curricular induction workshops, a dedicated transition day, team building and bonding activities. The school has channelled years of experience into creating a comprehensive transition guide and has a dedicated transition website where you can also find answers to your questions before your daughter starts with us in September.

OUTSTANDING PASTORAL CARE

THE PASTORAL CARE AT BRENTFORD SCHOOL FOR GIRLS IS OUTSTANDING. The school structure, pastoral programme, BLOSSOM (PSHCE) curriculum, well-being weeks, pastoral and Helping Undo Barriers (HUB) teams support the emotional development of all of our girls.

Students receive a daily tutor time lesson, which focusses on developing relationships with their peers and tutors. Within this programme, 'well-being weeks' run once per half term which focus on a different 'physical/mental health topic'.

This includes an assembly to raise awareness, activities within tutor time and a more indepth focus within the BLOSSOM curriculum.

Students who may need a little more support maybe considered for specific interventions through our specialist 'HUB' team. Students with both medical and special educational needs will be allocated a key worker who will offer support to remove any barriers to learn-

ing. At Brentford we pride ourselves on ensuring that 'every student counts' and can really fulfil their full potential.
