Dear Parent/Carer

What a year it has been once again!!!!! Following the disruptions of the previous year we certainly didn't think that we would be going into another lockdown in January this year! With the Prime Minister's announcement that the restrictions will be coming to an end, and the increase in vaccination levels, September feels like a new beginning.

We tried our very best last term to return to some of our end of year activities which have always been so important for bringing our community together and allowing the girls to develop some of those wider skills identified in our school vision. The annual Sports Day event, Activities Week, the Year 11 Prom, the Record of Achievement event and Sixth Form Leavers Party took place at the end of the summer term. All of these events were thoroughly risk assessed in order to ensure that they were safe for both students and staff and it is fantastic to be able to share with you the summer highlights.

As we move into the new school year, we have been busy planning for what the year ahead might look like and identifying priorities for 2021-22. We will continue to work with the girls to bridge any gaps in their learning, as a consequence of the lockdowns, as well as refocusing on developing the wider skills of our vision. Student well-being will continue to be a focus and we are lucky to be working with a fantastic organisation two days a week, who will be providing therapeutic support for our young people. We have also reorganised the school away from the girls learning in 'bubbles', and instead only facilitating bubble areas for the lunch and break times from September onwards. This will allow the girls to continue to stay in their own year groups at lunch times, whilst allowing them to move freely around the school during the school day to access the specialist facilities.

On behalf of the school I would like to thank you for your support and commitment over what has been a challenging year for us all. It is an absolute pleasure to serve such a fantastic school community and we look forward to new beginnings and returning to the vibrant and dynamic school life that is unique to Brentford School for Girls.

Starting secondary school is such an exciting time with so many opportunities for our young people as they begin a journey of deeper academic exploration.


These events are important in helping ensure the transition from primary to secondary is as seamless and positive as possible and that our new starters feel part of the 'Brentford family' from a very early stage.

ENCOURAGING DISCUSSION AND DEBATE

As part of our commitment to the SMSC provision for sixth formers, our PSE and RE day were held on 30th June during the summer term.

After the success of our workshop on mental health led by the 'Self Esteem Team' earlier in the year, we invited them back to lead a workshop on LGBTQ+. They describe the purpose of the workshop in the following way: "while progress is being made for LGBTQ+ rights, there is so much more work to be done to increase understanding and inclusivity. With sex and relationship education now mandatory, this is a huge step. Our brand-new class promises to deliver content on gender and sexuality with expertise in an age-appropriate approach"

The RE session was on the theme of race and equality and organised by the Head of RE, Ms Evans. During the session, year 12s watched the film SELMA, a film linked to the theme of race and explored the issue of racial equality in society today.

There were many fantastic discussions amongst the students surrounding the issues it raises and how we, as a school community, can seek to develop our understanding of race and move forward to have a positive influence on the wider community as a whole.

RIVERS OF THE WORLD

In July we were very excited to host professional artist Shona Watt for an special art workshop. This day of art making was part of the **Rivers of the World international art project**. Similar activities have taken place in schools around the world as students are challenged to learn new art skills as well as consider their environment.

Since our year 8 cohort have now chosen their GCSE subjects, we used this opportunity to welcome and inspire the year 8s who will be taking art next year. They had a day with Ms Watts who taught them essential skills in research, design and making. To link the river theme, the girls looked at ancient cultures and beliefs that celebrate and worship rivers and river goddesses. They also looked at more modern references such as theatrical costumes for concerts, festivals and parades.

After their careful research and design work, we were blown away by the beautiful and intricate wearable head-dresses made by the year 8s. They considered their materials, their time frame and techniques like professionals and should be very proud of themselves.

We look forward to seeing their work displayed in school and as well as being shared online after being professionally photographed. This project has been a wonderful reminder of the limitless inspiration we can take from nature, the reward of being brave enough to learn a new skill as well as how meaningful it is to be part of something happening in schools around the world.

CAREERS ENRICHMENT

Careers week was held in July and was filled with activities to support all students in years 7-10 develop those all-important employability skills: communication, team work and problem solving. Each year group had a dedicated day with a range of activities from an 'Elite Skills' team building exercise with the Army Outreach team to creating the perfect wedding outfit using only newspaper and sticky tape for year 9 students, an enterprise task for year 8 and input and information from the University of Roehampton for year 10 students.

The week was also supported by St Mary's University and West London College. Each year group was also able to access the careers portal Unifrog, to complete a skills and personality quiz, and research the careers library, packed with upto-date facts and figures (LMI) about 1000s of jobs and the qualifications and skills needed to do them.

The autumn term will be a busy one for the careers department as the school will once again be submitting evidence for re-accreditation of the prestigious Quality in Careers Standard (awarded in July 2018). The Quality in Careers Standard is the single national quality award for careers education, information, advice and guidance (CEIAG) in secondary schools.
