The Bronze award is open to Year 9, 10 and 12 students and runs from 1st January 2024 - 31st December 2024. For students taking part in their own skills outside school, we help to run the expeditions of which there are three in total.

- A day walk to Richmond Park to encourage the use of map work and navigational skills.
- A practice walk, held on a weekend, where the students put their skills into practice.
- An assessment expedition which takes place over the course of a weekend.
