

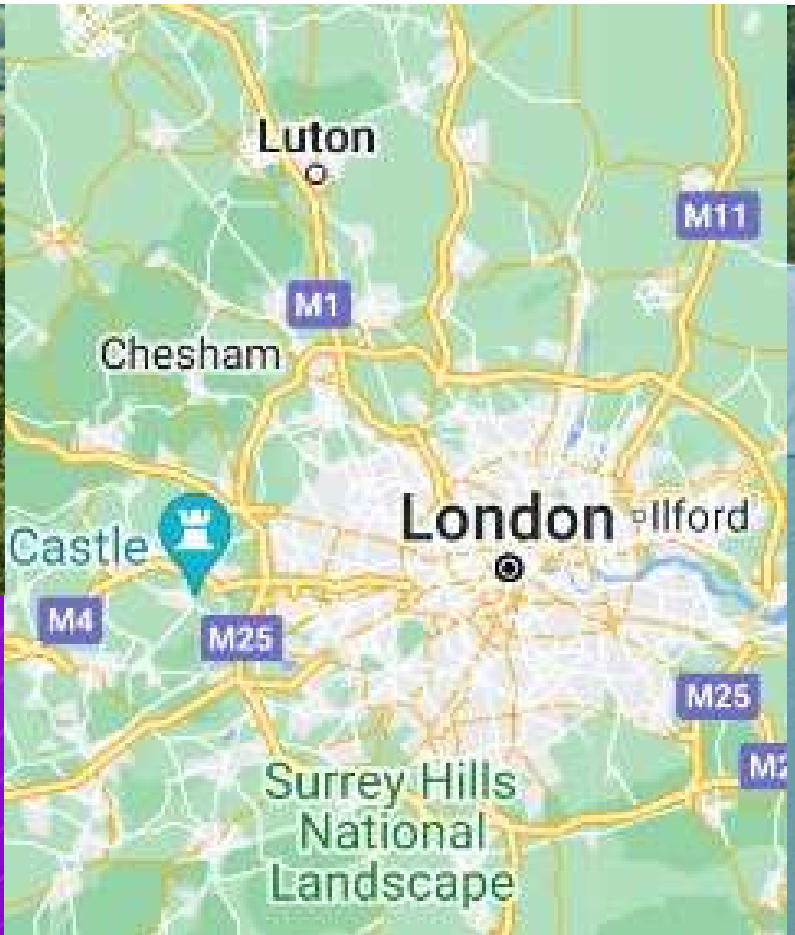




YOUTH WITHOUT LIMITS

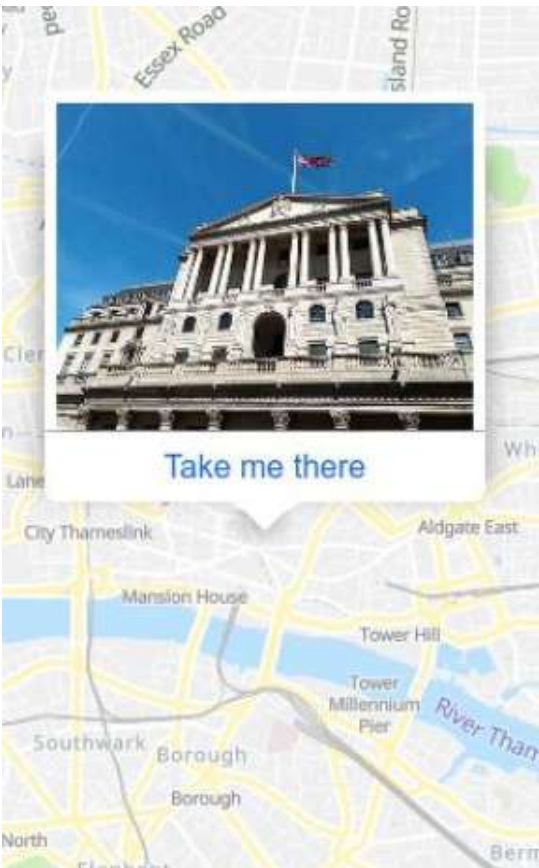
ACTIVITY DAY- CIRCUS WORKSHOP

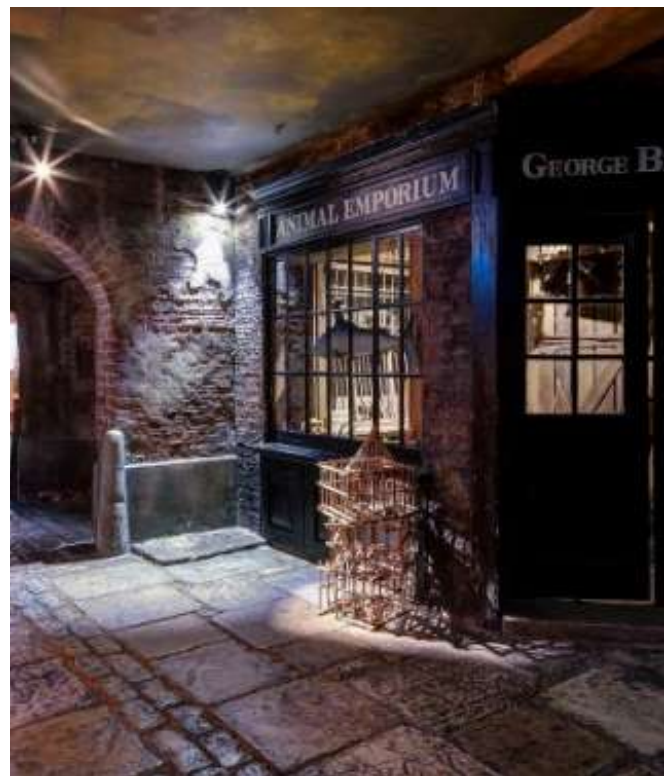

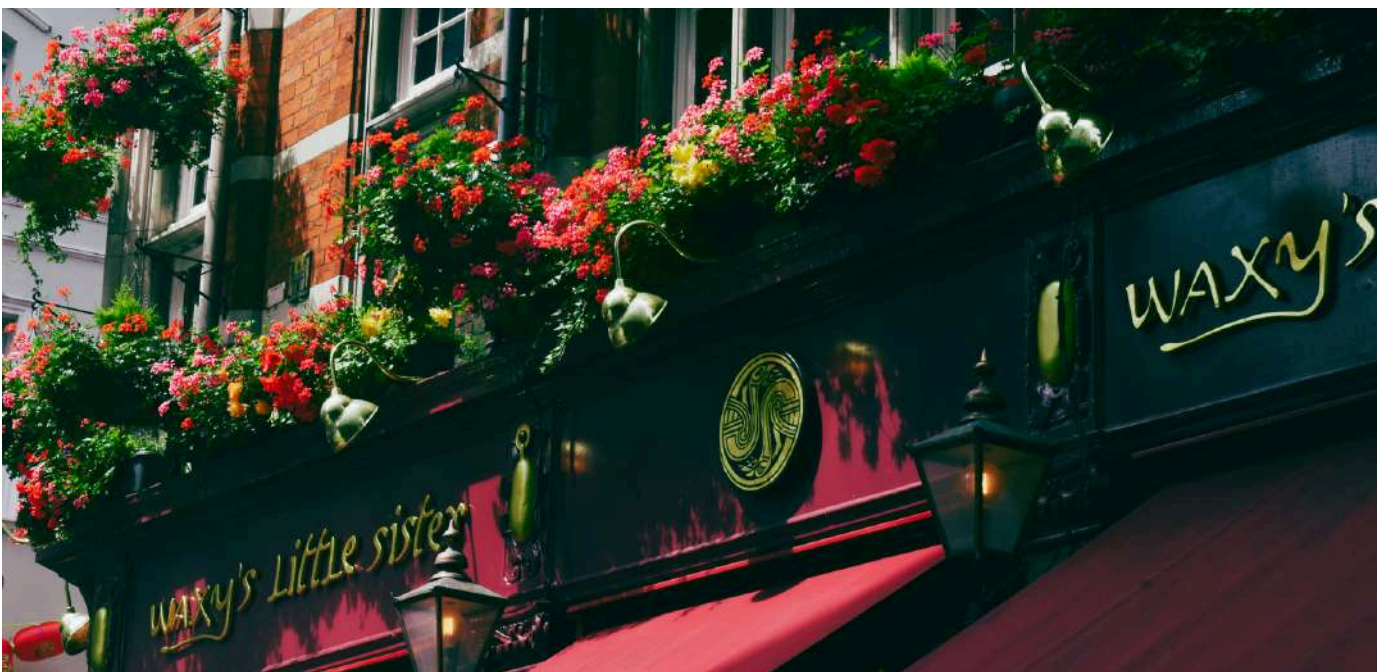
DOCKLANDS MUSEUM TRIP

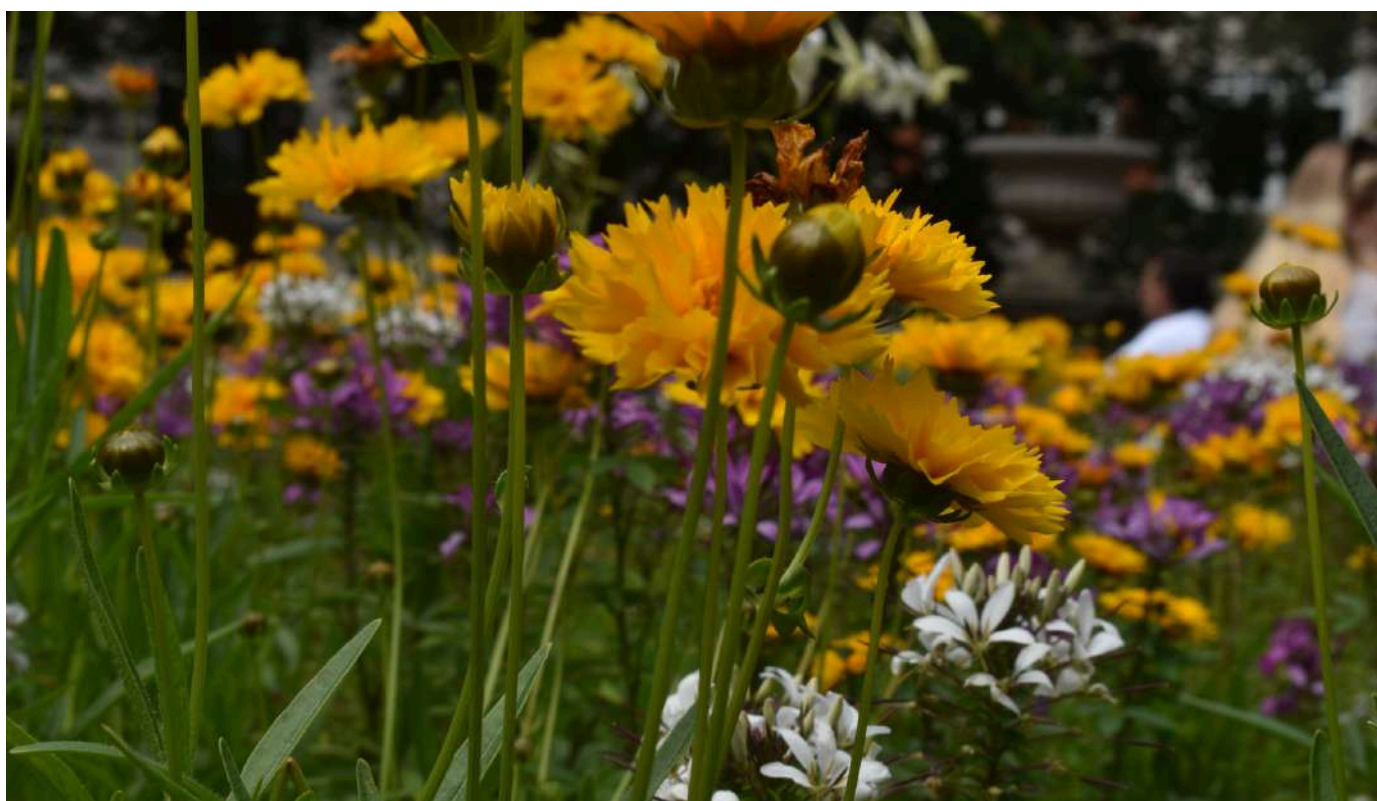

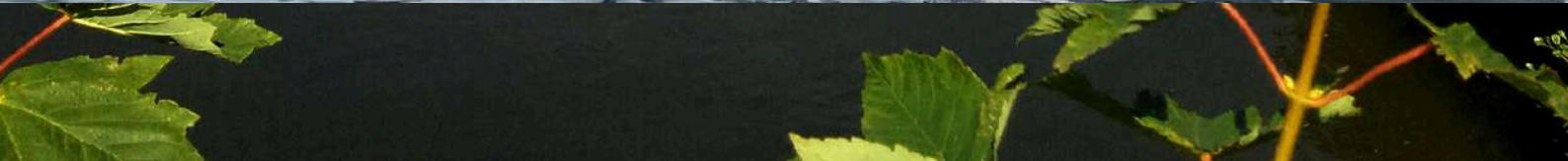

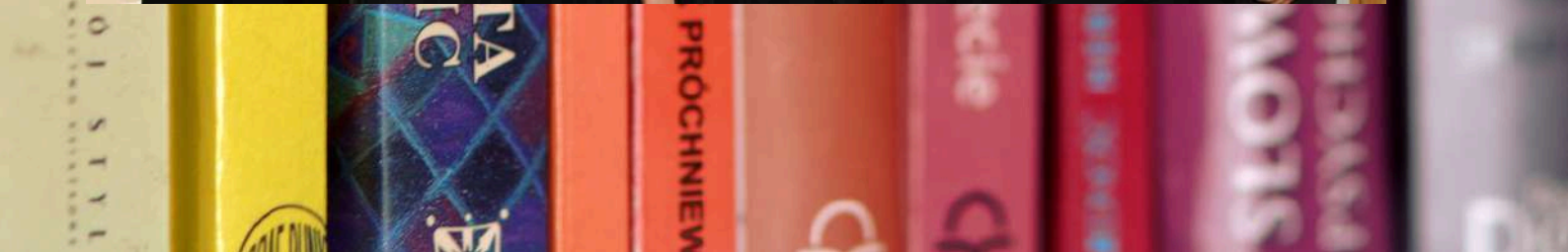
ROWING TRIP - ACTIVITY DAY
